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BEACONSFIELD ARTISTS ASSOCIATION

EXHIBITION HANDBOOK

The association typically holds two annual exhibitions, one in the autumn and one in the spring. Additional exhibits and activities where all members in good standing are invited to display and sell their artwork are planned and executed on a yearly basis. Information specifically related to these shows is provided as needed.

- Active, honorary, returning and new members must register annually, pay their fees and attend three general meetings per year to be eligible to exhibit up to the maximum number of artworks per exhibition.
- New members who have paid their fees may, at the executive team's discretion, be permitted to display
 one artwork in the Autumn Exhibition.
- Artists can exhibit up to a maximum of four paintings totalling 150 linear inches. Add the height + width
 of each painting, including the outer dimensions of the frame to calculate the linear inches.
- Unframed canvases must be standard gallery format with at least a 1.5 inch profile, finished edges.
- Sculptors (three-dimensional art: sculpture, ceramics, china) may exhibit up to a maximum of four pieces totalling 150 linear inches. Add the height + width of each piece.
- Depth should be included on artwork identification tags.
- Exhibitors will be invited to replace sold artwork during an exhibition.
- A 15% deduction from the submitted artwork selling price will be donated to our partner charity.
- The 15% charitable donation is applicable on all sales of exhibited artwork for one month after the exhibition date.
- Registration submissions are due by the deadline at <u>artbeaconsfield.com</u> and hanging fees can be paid to <u>payments@artbeaconsfield.com</u>. Printable registration forms are available on the BAA website.

- Please print your own SUBMITTED ARTWORK form or contact your telephone committee liaison for help. Printable Submitted Artwork forms are available on the BAA website. See - Exhibitions / Forms
- Exhibitors are responsible to fill in the provided BAA Artwork Identification Tags. Ten blank tags are
 distributed at the September General Meeting and should be sufficient for both the Autumn and Spring
 Exhibitions. For additional tags contact your telephone committee liaison for help.

ARTWORK DROP OFF

- Bring your completed SUBMITTED ARTWORK form and completed BAA Artwork Identification Tags to the Art Work Drop-Off location on the designated date and time. This completed form serves as our master list with your information.
- Upon arrival you are requested to sign the waiver and fill out, if needed, BAA supplied Artwork Identification Tags
- The Drop Off Committee will inspect your dried, framed or unframed, wired, ready-to-hang works. Unframed artwork must have a minimum 1.5 inch profile, attractively finished. Artwork should be wired with D-ring hangers. Saw-tooth hangers are not compatible with available hanging systems. The frame material itself must be in sturdy and good visual condition. Please have your painting tags attached to your artwork so they may be easily removed and displayed beside your artwork.
- It is the artist's responsibility to unwrap submitted artwork and place where directed.
- Raffle Donation Artwork must be received during the Drop Off prior to the scheduled hanging time.
- Exhibition space is limited and planned ahead of time. Please respect the registration deadline and maximum linear inch allotment.
- Artists may update their two-page bilingual biography at any given drop off. The Association's Artist
 Binder is kept on display during our shows. New artists will find their designated two-page space
 identified alphabetically by a Post-it note. Please discard the Post-it after adding your bio.

VERNISSAGE and EXHIBITION

- Although not mandatory, participating artists are encouraged to be present at the vernissage. Your adoring public awaits!
- All members are welcome to participate and volunteer during the vernissage and exhibition, including those not exhibiting.
- · Please indicate two volunteer time choices on your registration form and one will be assigned.
- City of Beaconsfield employees are welcome to volunteer before or after their working hours.
- A group photo will be taken at the end of the exhibition. All are welcome.
- Artwork is not to be removed until the exhibition has officially closed.
- 100% of raffle ticket sales will be donated to partnering charity. The winning raffle will be drawn at the
 exhibition's closing.
- The Coup de Cœur winner will be announced at the next association general meeting.

ARTWORK DONATION

- All members are eligible to submit an artwork donation towards the raffle in support of our partnering charity.
- A call for submissions will be included in an Artist Link newsletter. One artwork will be drawn at random and featured on advertisement media for that exhibition.
